REGISTRATION

TRANSPORTATION

Edinburgh International Airport is the most convenient entry point for your international journey to the conference and is approximately twenty-five minutes by car/taxi from the city-centre. Trains and buses also operate between the airport and the city-centre – see the airport website for details (above).

If you arrive into Glasgow International Airport, CityLink (www.citylink.co.uk) operate a shuttle bus service to Edinburgh city centre, which takes approximately 2 hours with a change of bus in Glasgow city centre. Trains operate between the two city centres (www.nationalrail.co.uk) and the journey takes approximately 1 hour. Car hire facilities are available at both airports.
